The Minutes as mailed to members of the Board were accepted and approved by unanimous vote. Carol then presented the costs of the Golf Outing and Square Dance and the GWLPOA bank balance of \$6,936.46.

For the Golf Outing, it was suggested that the cost of the Dinner and outing include both Willowbrook and Jonathon's rather than just Willowbrook, as Jonathon's charged \$20 per head for dinner. The proposal was accepted and approved and Carol will make the suggested changes. As of 9-16-19 we have a balance of \$6,936.46.

Lillian has asked the Board to set aside \$5,000 as there will be a new directory in 2020. She indicated that she would like to get more technical help to put together the Directory. The addresses are duplicates and we would like larger print. All concurred that she is welcome to get help as the programs where the data is located is difficult to change and more advanced knowledge is needed.

The 2019 Square Dance had an attendance of 53 people and the total cost was a negative \$357.89. Everyone loved the Fuzzy Pig Barn, the food, the flowers and the caller. The Square Dance was a success. The comments by everyone were very positive.

Pat suggested that we have our Fall outing a little later next year as people were missing the notice for a Fall outing after the notice for a Golf outing. However, if we have the outing too late, people will be leaving for warmer weather. We will try to notify people in a different manner next year.

Pat mentioned that we need to reach out to the new Rounders in a better way and by younger people. Nancy L said she would be happy to take this on. She will contact Theresa Stegman who welcomes new people to the lake and have her let us know people who are Rounders (live here all year) and she will contact them to let them know all our activities available to them on the Lake and in Whitewater. Lillian mentioned that there are 18 new families that have moved in this year.

Cathy and Lillian are working with the Town of Whitewater to notify boaters when there is a "No Wake" situation. They are suggesting we buy sleeves for the buoys with our buoy money and place signs and orange flags. Cathy and Lillian are looking for good signage that will work

at all the launches. They asked that we set aside \$1,000 for safety signs and sleeves, etc. It was unanimously approved. Nancy D suggested a message in our Newsletters letting boaters know that if there is severe rain the lake may be No-Wake. It was suggested that Flip signs would be better than sleeves as they would require people to place them on the buoys and it will be difficult to find volunteers. It was also noted that our water patrol, Sean is done for this year.

Since we have more money for donations it was suggested we again give Sean \$100 for ice cream for children wearing life preservers while in the boat. We increased our donation to \$500 to Lake View School for food for children, \$500 to the Food Pantry and of course the original \$1,000 for Safety.

August 15 or 22 – Golf Outing – Annual Meeting is on August 22

September 12 – Trivia Night – Lion’s Club is not large enough, Cathy suggested a tent for good to enable two more tables to allow for 100 people rather than the 80 we had in 2018. Suggestion of first come first served basis on attendance.

Lillian suggested we have a music night on the lake on the night between the Ski Team performance and JNT fireworks. The musical would take place in front of the Lion’s club using their electricity for a band. It would run from 8:00pm to approximately 9:30. It would be “Boats and Music on the Lake”. All efforts approved by the Board to check into the costs and possibilities.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 am.
